Giving Tuesday, a global day of charitable giving following Thanksgiving, is December 1! This year, we are raising funds to replace Hobart the dishwasher. He's so old no one can remember exactly when he joined the team, but he's been around at least 40 years! Stressful mid-camp breakdowns 3 of the last 4 summers and a call this spring from our equipment rep informing us they couldn't continue to service him because replacement parts are no longer manufactured made the decision to retire him necessary. A replacement unit will cost around \$11,000 which is a significant amount, but those \$25, \$50, or \$100 donations really add up when a large number of people give. 2020 was so very challenging and also a success story! Early in 2020 the board of directors had decided it was time to hire a 2nd full-time employee. The search began for an assistant director and we had so many good applicants. Emily fit perfectly with what we were looking for in an assistant director and she accepted the job offer.

Before she could even start everything went sideways with COVID-19. I did not think summer camps would happen this year. The board had many discussions on if we could or should host camps in the summer. Many – sometimes strong – thoughts and opinions were shared. In the end an overwhelming vote was cast in favor of hosting summer camps in whatever way was allowed by the state of Indiana. Around 80% of Indiana camps completely cancelled their summer sessions, but we were able to modify our schedule and we safely held camps in July. I'm so thankful that we were able to give campers a place to get away.

A few weeks ago, we were able to host a fall retreat for older students. It was an awesome weekend and campers are already asking for a

spring camp. Another success in a hard year!

From a financial perspective we took a hit, like many others. Camp attendance was down and donations are well behind previous

years. Our board of directors has worked over the past several years to improve the financial stability of the camp and I am so thankful for that. Because of the wisdom of the board and generous donations by many people, we had an emergency fund in place for tough times like those brought by COVID-19. Praise be to God for that. On the flip side, we have used our emergency fund and we now need to replenish it as both COVID-19 unknowns linger and

> to prepare for future emergencies. Our year-end fundraising effort will be focused rebuilding our emergency fund. I see this as the most critical year-end need we have had
