

Summer Camp Recap!

What an amazing summer! During Mission Camp in early June, more than 70 volunteers helped us prepare the facilities and grounds for the summer camp season. Over the rest of June and July, over 100 staff and volunteers welcomed 512 campers during our 7 youth camp sessions, an increase of 16% since summer 2013. We had campers from as far away as Arizona and even Saudi Arabia! We are especially thankful for the opportunity to minister to the 35 campers who did not have a home church, more than triple the number last year. Also, through our scholarship fund, our generous donors and church partners were able to provide registration fee assistance to 56 campers who otherwise would not have been able to attend camp.

Our theme this year was ASTRONOMICAL, based on Psalm 8:3-4: "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them,

human beings that you care for them?" Our fantastic weekly program directors emphasized God's huge love for us even in our smallness amid his vast Creation. Some camps experienced this vastness first-hand, viewing

Camper Connection: Maggie and Gracie Ledbetter

Board member Stephenie Knoll interviews campers (and twin sisters!) Maggie and Gracie Ledbetter about their experiences at Camp Challenge.

A few weeks ago, I was sitting in a pew at Church at the Crossing, watching baptisms and listening to testimonies. Each moved me to tears, but there were two that particularly stirred my heart -Maggie and Gracie Ledbetter. The "Ledbetter Twins," as most people refer to them, shared how they made the decision to make a public declaration of their faith during an evening of worship at Camp Challenge. As a camp director and member of the Board of Directors of Camp Challenge, my desire, as well as the desire of those that serve with me, is that God will use that camp to create an environment that grows faith in our children.

I caught up with the Ledbetter girls and asked them to share a little more about their experience and love for Camp Challenge. I wish I could put into words their maturity and bubbling enthusiasm. As most twins do, they share a lot of the same opinions, talk over each other, and finish each other's sentences. These are beautiful girls.

S: So, when did you two start going

to Camp Challenge?

M: Maybe first grade.

G: (Looking to mother, Lynn) Is that right, Mom?

M: And we only did like two years at the first camp and we liked it so much we went to the longer camp.

S: You went to the Young Explorer's Camp and then the longer camp?

M/G: Yeah.

S: What is your favorite thing about camp?

M: I like how in the morning, the afternoon and the evening, we all get together and worship and nobody really judges you and you can discuss anything. I just like the worship we do.

G: Yeah, we go to the one in the morning and we sing and talk about our lesson. We have this Bible study thing where we go on our separate ways and read what they told us to read, and we do that three times a day – one in the morning, one in the afternoon, and one close to night.

S: What about your cabins? Did you feel like you got really close to the girls in your cabin?

M/G: Yeah!

M: During naptime we would discuss our lesson and I guess over time you just get really close because you do a lot of activities together and you get

comfortable with them even though you have no idea who they are at the beginning.

G: You sit with them at lunch, too.

M: Yeah you spend a lot of time with them and you grow to where you like spending a lot of time with them. And it's fun learning where they are from and about their family.

S: Even though people often confuse you, and think you are the same person, you're really, really different, right? One of the things I noticed though in your baptism testimony, is you both made the decision to be baptized at Camp Challenge. Did you tell each other, or do it together? How did it happen?

G: We did the walk-through...

M: Stages of the Cross

G: Yeah, Stages of the Cross. They took us through the woods and they had the counselors dressed up as people before Jesus died. Josh (Mifflin) was Jesus. They had people shouting and the soldiers and after that...

M: A lot of people were very emotional and there was the pond and the cross and we went there and one of the counselors started

playing songs on the guitar and it was just kind of silent and we all prayed together and...

G: And then this one guy, he told everybody, "If you want to get baptized, then you can all come up here. " So we kind of made a circle and prayed and then we sang songs after that, too.

S: So you two made these decisions, but completely separately? Did you talk about it later?

G: Yeah.

M: I didn't actually find out until we got home when I told my mom and then Grace told her and she said, "So you both..." and I went, "What??"

S: That's neat.

M: Uh huh....

S: What would you like people to know about camp?

G: That you can be yourself. It doesn't matter what you dress in, and it doesn't matter who you're friends with, you get to have fun and be yourself.

M: And you're free to worship how you want. You don't have to worry about anyone making fun of you and you can just be yourself. You also have freedom to move around or stay with your friends.

S: If someone asked what your dream would be for Camp Challenge, or what would you love to see at Camp Challenge, what would you say?

G: I guess like... I don't know why, but there are a lot of kids from Church at the Crossing, and some kids from other churches. What would be cool is if a lot of other people from other churches come, too.

M: Yeah, so we can meet new people. We could interact with other churches and meet someone new.

S: How long do you think you'll go to Camp Challenge? Would you like to be a counselor?

M/G: Yes!

M: Definitely.

I'd say the future of Camp Challenge looks pretty good.
